1. Constitutional Money: Creates a transactional currency backed by "gold and silver," and recognizes it as "legal tender."

2. Funding Government Schools: Authorizes \$8.5 billion in new funding to public schools, including for teacher and staff pay raises, early-childhood programs, and bilingual education.
Estimated Cost per household: **-\$755.00/year.**

3. State-sanctioned Migrant Labor Camps: Performs "outreach and education" to inform "migrant agricultural workers" of their "rights," studies the "need" for "additional or improved migrant labor housing facilities," and locates "unlicensed migrant labor housing facilities" without identifying "individual migrant agricultural workers."

4. Repealing the Crime of Homosexual Conduct: Would have repealed the criminal offense of homosexual conduct in state law.

5. Texas Sovereignty Act: Would begin a formal process for Texas to declare certain federal acts as unconstitutional and prevent their enforcement.

6. Article V Convention: Applies to Congress to "call a convention under Article V of the United States Constitution."
