1. Income-tax Reduction: Would reduce Georgia's personal income tax by exempting the first \$50,000 of income for single filers and the first \$100,000 for married couples filing jointly. ✓

2. Repealing Tax Exemption for Data Centers: Would repeal Georgia's sales-and-use-tax exemption for data-center equipment. ✓

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **Yes** · SB410 · Passed 32–21 · 03/06/2026

3. Self-defense: Would expand Georgia's self-defense laws by adding another justification for using force in defense of oneself or others, and broadens civil-liability immunity. ✓

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **Yes** · SB572 · Passed 30–23 · 03/06/2026

4. Repealing Prohibition on Silencers: Would repeal Georgia's state-level prohibition on possessing firearm suppressors, also called silencers. ✓

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **Yes** · SB499 · Passed 30–20 · 03/06/2026

5. Government After-school Pre-kindergarten: Requires certain Georgia public schools that offer after-school programs to make those programs available to pre-kindergarten students. ✗

Constitutional: **No** · Cast: **Yes** · HB1123 · Passed 46–0 · 03/19/2026

6. Regulating Stablecoins: Establishes a state licensing-and-regulatory system for payment-stablecoin issuers. ✗

Constitutional: **No** · Cast: **Yes** · HB1272 · Passed 50–1 · 04/02/2026



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
