1. Nullification: Firearms: Exempts firearms and firearm accessories made and kept entirely within New Hampshire from federal regulation.

2. State Sovereignty: Declares that the World Health Organization, United Nations, and World Economic Forum have no jurisdiction or power in New Hampshire.

3. Education Freedom Accounts: Expands eligibility for the state's Education Freedom Account program.		
Constitutional: No · Cast: Yes · SB295 · Passed 190–178 · 06/05/2025		
4. Parental Bill of Rights: Establishes a broad "parents' bill of rights" in education.		
Constitutional: Yes · Cast: Yes · SB72 · Passed 214–167 · 06/05/2025		
5. Vaccine Exemption Expansion: Expands the state's vaccine-exemption law by allowing parents to exempt their children from school immunization requirements based on religious belief without needing documentation from a religious organization.		
Constitutional: Yes · Cast: Yes · HB358 · Passed 194–153 · 06/12/2025		
6. ISO New England: Directs Department of Energy to investigate whether New Hampshire should withdraw from ISO New England.		
Constitutional: Yes · Cast: Yes · HB690 · Passed 188–155 · 06/12/2025
