1. Nullification: Firearms: Exempts firearms and firearm accessories made and kept entirely within New Hampshire from federal regulation. ✗

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **No** · HB381 · Passed 205–168 · 02/20/2025

2. State Sovereignty: Declares that the World Health Organization, United Nations, and World Economic Forum have no jurisdiction or power in New Hampshire. ✗

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **No** · HB584 · Passed 198–162 · 03/27/2025

3. Education Freedom Accounts: Expands eligibility for the state's Education Freedom Account program. ✓

Constitutional: **No** · Cast: **No** · SB295 · Passed 190–178 · 06/05/2025

4. Parental Bill of Rights: Establishes a broad "parents' bill of rights" in education. ✗

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **No** · SB72 · Passed 214–167 · 06/05/2025

5. Vaccine Exemption Expansion: Expands the state's vaccine-exemption law by allowing parents to exempt their children from school immunization requirements based on religious belief without needing documentation from a religious organization. ✗

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **No** · HB358 · Passed 194–153 · 06/12/2025

6. ISO New England: Directs Department of Energy to investigate whether New Hampshire should withdraw from ISO New England. ✗

Constitutional: **Yes** · Cast: **No** · HB690 · Passed 188–155 · 06/12/2025



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
