1. **SJR0054 Rescind Con-Con (Passed 66 to 42 on 4/8/2022).** Rescinds of all previous requests by the Illinois Legislature for a convention under Article V of the United States Constitution.

2. **SB818 Sex Education Standards (Passed 60 to 46 on 5/28/2021).** Makes Illinois the first state to implement sex-education that aligns with the extremely explicit and perverse National Sex Education Standards (NSES).

3. **HB562 Gun Owner Rights (Passed 75 to 40 on 6/16/2021).** Restricts firearm sales, imposes registration requirements and imposes rules on the private transfer of guns.

4. **SB3865 Woke Terminology (Passed 94 to 7 on 4/7/2022).** Removes the "dehumanizing" term "alien" from all Illinois statutory provisions.

5. **HB209 Latex Glove Ban (Passed 100 to 5 on 3/3/2022).** Food service establishments and health care facilities may not permit employees to use latex gloves.

6. **HB5549 African-American Aids Response Act (Passed 105 to 0 on 3/4/2022).** Ensures funds should provide resources for creating and maintaining at least one Black-led Center of Excellence HIV Biomedical Resource Hub for every \$3,000,000 of available funding to improve Black health.

Why do these votes matter?

1. Rescind Con-Con

SJR0054 rescinds of all previous requests by the Illinois Legislature for a convention under Article V of the United States Constitution.

The Illinois State House of Representatives passed SJR0054 on April 8, 2022 by a vote of 66 to 42. We have assigned pluses to the ayes because a so-called "Convention of the States" would not be of "limited" purpose. Article V of the U.S. Constitution was designed to correct structural deficiencies in the federal government, not the behavior of its elected officials. This rescission is a great step at preserving the constitution. We need more precise, and immediate solutions that would restore power back to the states and to the people.

2. Sex Education Standards

SB818 makes Illinois the first state to implement sex-education that aligns with the extremely explicit and perverse National Sex Education Standards (NSES).

The Illinois State House of Representatives passed SB818 on May 28, 2021 by a vote of 60 to 48. We have assigned pluses to the nays because this bill is pushing a more progressive curriculum in Illinois schools. We believe getting our children out of public school is the primary solution because of the indoctrination we are seeing with this progressive curriculum across the country.

3. Gun Owner Rights

HB562 states if legal firearm owners voluntarily submit fingerprints with your FOID renewal than their application skips ahead of those who choose to not submit fingerprints. This bill also provides that any person who is not a federally licensed firearm dealer shall, before selling or transferring the firearms, must contact the Illinois State Police with the transferee's or purchaser's Firearm Owner's Identification Card number to determine the validity of the transferee's or purchaser's ID Card.

The Illinois State House of Representatives passed HB562 on June 16, 2021 by a vote of 75 to 40. We have assigned pluses to the nays because the fundamental right of the American people to keep and bear arms is protected by the 2nd Amendment and that right should not be infringed upon. The Constitution does not limit where a gun or firearm can or cannot be used.

4. Woke Terminology

SB3865 removes the "dehumanizing" term "alien" from all Illinois statutory provisions.

The Illinois State House of Representatives passed SB3865 on April 7, 2022 by a vote of 94 to 7. We have assigned pluses to the nays because this bill is conforming to the woke leftist culture that focuses on virtue signaling and being politically correct.

5. Latex Glove Ban

HB209 enacts that a food service establishment may not permit employees to use latex gloves in the preparation and handling of food. To encourage compliance, the Department of Public Health shall send a notice of warning to a food service establishment for its first violation of specified provisions. Prohibits the use of latex gloves by EMS personnel in 2023 and health care facility personnel in 2024.

The Illinois State House of Representatives passed HB209 on March 3, 2022 by a vote of 100 to 5. We have assigned pluses to the nays because this is unnecessary government interference in the operation of private healthcare and business. This legislation is just another step that the government has taken to interfere in commerce. There are other ways to address allergies and concerns than to restrict something completely.

6. African-American Aids Response Act

HB5549 Provides that the African-American HIV/AIDS Response Fund should provide resources for creating and maintaining at least one Black-led Center of Excellence HIV Biomedical Resource Hub for every \$3,000,000 of available funding to improve Black health and eliminate Black HIV-related health disparities.

The Illinois State House of Representatives passed HB5549 on March 4, 2022 by a vote of 105 to 0. We have assigned pluses to the nays because this legislation was created in the name of equity, propping up another race over another. The left has been promoting woke radical Marxist ideas for years regarding race and sexual orientation. The government and taxpayer dollars should not be embracing these ideas.
