Estimated cost per household: -\$1,248.00/year.

5. S 2578 Debt Limit (Passed 68 to 29 on 6/11/2002, Roll Call 148). Would increase the public debt limit by \$450 billion for a new ceiling of \$6.4 trillion. See U.S. Const., Art. 1, Sec. 8. **YES** ✗
Estimated cost per household: -\$4,117.00/year.

6. HJR 114 War Authorization Against Iraq (Passed 77 to 23 on 10/11/2002, Roll Call 237). Authorizes the use of U.S. military force against Iraq, including to enforce any related UN Security Council resolutions. **NO** ★
