2. WTO Withdrawal: To withdraw the U.S. from the World Trade Organization (WTO). **✗**

4. Border Security: Would authorize 700 miles of security fence to be built on the U.S.-Mexican border and make unlawful entry into the United States a criminal offense. **—**

5. Gun Seizure: Would prohibit the confiscation of firearms in the wake of a natural disaster. **—**

6. Electronic Surveillance: Would allow electronic surveillance of communications with suspected terrorists without first obtaining approval from the secret FISA Court. **—**

Constitutional: **No** · Cast: None · H.R. 5825 · 09/28/2006
