5. **SB3257 Government-funded Food Pantries** (passed 115 to 1 on 4/1/2025). Authorizes the Marshall County Board of Supervisors to provide annual financial contributions to 501(c)(3) charitable organizations that operate food pantries. **NO**

6. **SB2573 Creating the Department of Tourism** (passed 107 to 9 on 4/1/2025). Would have created the Mississippi Department of Tourism as a new state agency. **NO**
