| 1. <b>H606 Ban on State-sponsored Sex Mutilation</b> (passed 69 to 41 on 5/6/2025). | 2. <b>H379 Article V Convention</b> (passed 62 to 51 on 5/7/2025). | 3. <b>S153 North Carolina Border Protection Act</b> (passed 60 to 46 on 6/4/2025). | 4. <b>S50 Permitless Firearm Carry</b> (passed 59 to 48 on 6/11/2025). | 5. <b>H307 Iryna's Law</b> (passed 81 to 31 on 9/23/2025). | 6. <b>S405 Increasing Medicaid Funding</b> (passed 100 to 0 on 10/22/2025).
