1. Speed-enforcement Cameras: Extends New York City's school-zone speed-camera program. ✗

2. Forced Firearm Storage: Strengthens gun-storage laws by criminalizing unsafe storage based on severity, requiring offenders to receive safety materials, and mandating state reporting on child firearm injuries and deaths. ✗

3. "Human Rights" Housing: Amends New York's Executive Law to officially include the "disparate impact" standard in the state's Human Rights Law related to housing. ✗

4. Minority Business Contracts: Requires every state agency in New York that awards contracts to create a three-year growth plan aimed at increasing the participation of minority- and women-owned business enterprises (MWBES) in contracts and subcontracts. ✗

5. Assisted Suicide: Would allow a mentally competent adult with a terminal illness and a doctor's prognosis of six months or less to request and self-administer medication to peacefully end his or her life. ✗

6. Warrant Requirement: Mandates that government agents must obtain a search warrant before accessing electronic device data—whether searching devices physically or accessing communications electronically. ✓
