3. **A4040 "Human Rights" Housing (Passed 95 to 46 on 6/6/2025).** Amends New York's Executive Law to officially include the "disparate impact" standard in the state's Human Rights Law related to housing. **NONE**

5. **A136 Assisted Suicide (Passed 81 to 67 on 4/29/2025).** Would allow a mentally competent adult with a terminal illness and a doctor's prognosis of six months or less to request and self-administer medication to peacefully end his or her life. **NO**



6. **A2565 Warrant Requirement (Passed 93 to 56 on 3/26/2025).** Mandates that government agents must obtain a search warrant before accessing electronic device data—whether searching devices physically or accessing communications electronically. **NO**
