1. HB2764 Eliminating Income Taxes (passed 34 to 11 on 5/22/2025). **NO**

Establishes, as the "Bringing Sitcoms Home from Hollywood Pilot Program Act," tax-incentive rebate payments for live audience episodic television in Oklahoma. **✗**

6. SB990 Recall Elections (passed 31 to 15 on 3/27/2025). **YES**
